League By-Laws/Rules for Summer/Fall 2019 season

Standard USSSA rules will be used for league play:

Notable changes by USSSA: 2019: Two rule changes

- 1- If a batter steps into the batter's box with an illegal bat, they are called out and the player is ejected immediately from the game.
- 2- In Class E (Only) A homerun ends the inning but is not an offensive ejection or a slot out in tournament play only.

2019 Season:

The summer league season for Men and Women will be 14 games and Co-Ed will be 12 games. Tentative start of league will be 04/22/19. If you are an out of town team we offer double headers (7:30 & 8:30 time slots) with one week on and the next week off. We will continue Fall League. Start date depends on end of Summer League TBD.

League registration fees:

Cashier's check or money order ONLY; made out to "Santa Fe Softball Association". Include your team name in the memo.

Complete registration means that you, have a filled out roster, sanction form and full payment

When filing out your roster, make sure that your player names match their names on their driver's license/photo ID.

Early pre-registration: 01/01/19 to 01/31/19 = \$650.00. (CO-ED = \$500.00)

Pre-registration: 02/01/19 to 02/28/19 = \$675.00. (CO-ED = \$525.00)

Regular registration: 03/01/19 to 03/31/19 = \$700.00. (CO-ED = \$550.00)

Late registration: 04/01/19 to 04/05/19 = \$750.00. (CO-ED = \$600.00)

If you (or your team affiliation) still owe SFSA any fees for any prior seasons and or tournaments, you will NOT be allowed any type of participation in the current season and or tournaments until you have fulfilled your prior obligation in full. This includes old fees and current fees.

There will be a mandatory coach's meeting on March 29, 2019 @ 6:00 PM at the FOP 3300 Calle Maria Luisa to discuss by-laws, team alignment, new rules, etc.

SFSA SEASON OPENER April 13 & 14, 2019 = \$225.00. Double Elimination format.

Bats Men/Women/Mixed:

Bats must have the standard USSSA mark on the taper of the bat as placed by the bat manufacturer in order to be legal for play. See illustration below.

New USSSA Softball Bat Marks & Grandfathering Rules Effective January 1, 2012

Effective January 1, 2012

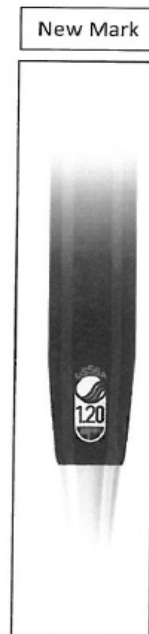
- Have the new permanent¹ USSSA Mark on its taper OR
- Have the old permanent¹ USSSA mark OR
- Be a Wood Bat

ALL of the above must be manufactured by an approved USSSA Bat Licensee

Effective January 1, 2013

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¹ USSSA marks and other graphics of the bat must be applied permanently and must be applied by the USSSA licensed manufacturer. No stickers or decals are allowed and no one may add graphics to a bat once manufactured. Use of a bat with graphics not applied by the manufacturer will be use of an altered bat and subject to suspension under the USSSA Altered Bat rules. In addition to being violation of the USSSA Altered Bat rules, any use, creation or application of a USSSA mark without written permission of USSSA is a violation of Federal Trademark law and may result in prosecution by USSSA. If you have any concern about the person selling or providing you a bat, do not accept the bat, because you will be held responsible for any bat you bring into or use in a USSSA facility.

Altered Bats:

If caught using altered/illegal bat the following penalties may apply:

Confiscation of bat with monetary fee for return at end of the year.

3 game suspension (board decision)

Umpires have the right to have a bat tested at any time.

Balls:

Teams will need to provide their own balls.

- Men – 12" USSSA Classic M (.40 COR) Slow Pitch Softballs optic yellow cover



The above stamp must be visible on all balls used for play.

- Women – 11" USSSA Classic W (.44 COR) Slow Pitch Softballs



The above stamp must be visible on all balls use for play.

Player pick-ups:

A pick-up player can only play if he or she is within a one division separation from the team that he or she is listed via team roster.

All players must be on a roster in order to play.

Opposing team must approve if other team can pick-up players.

Only two pick-up players allowed per team.

Teams that pick up players will surrender 2 runs per player to the other team.

If both teams pick up players then there will be offsetting runs per player.

(Home runs over the limit are considered outs)

Game nights and game times:

Monday: Co-Ed (all divisions)	6:30	7:30	8:30
Tuesday: Mens Div. 2 and 3	6:30	7:30	8:30
Wednesday: Mens Div. 1 / Womens Div. 1 & 2	6:30	7:30	8:30
Thursday: Mens Div. 4 and 5 / Womens Div 3 & 4	6:30	7:30	8:30

Game time for league play is 55 minutes. In the event of a tie and a game goes into extra innings, we will use the "Drop Dead Time" (DDT) and "International Tie-Breaker" (ITB) rule. Thus an extra ten minutes will be added to your game time (65 minutes total). Once the additional ten minutes is up, then regardless of outcome, the game is over.

Ethics / Rules:

Each team is responsible for cleaning their dug out after each game.

If dug out is not clean after a team has used it, then a cleaning fee will be charged to responsible team

Trash fees are due before next game.

If trash fee is not paid prior to next game, then that game will be forfeited.
This will continue till fee is paid.

The trash fee is \$10.00 per team per incident.

Recycling bins will be on-site for aluminum cans only.

No alcohol or drugs will be permitted in the dug outs or park.

Ethics / Rules (cont'd):

No glass containers will be permitted.

Boom Boxes/portable music players are not permitted per USSSA rules.

Conduct your players and fans in an orderly fashion. Coaches are responsible for player's language, attitude and or actions. Keep in mind that there are children and elders that attend games. If you can't conduct yourself in an appropriate manner then we will ask you to leave the park. We reserve the right to refuse service to anyone. That means concession stand, parking lot, and all fields at the MRC in general. *** **ZERO TOLERANCE*****

All players must be 18 years of age in order to play. If you have a minor player (under the age of 18) or a special needs player, he/she must fill out a consent form signed by their parent or guardian and all minor players must be over 16 years of age. Parents/guardian assume all liability for this player.

Notables:

Only players that are on the roster of the team that is currently playing may be allowed access to the dugout areas. Any coach/team that allows any persons in the dugout areas during games that are not on the roster, assumes all liability for said persons and relieves Santa Fe Softball Association or USSSA of any liability.

Teams are encouraged to look into team insurance for additional coverage for their players.
